



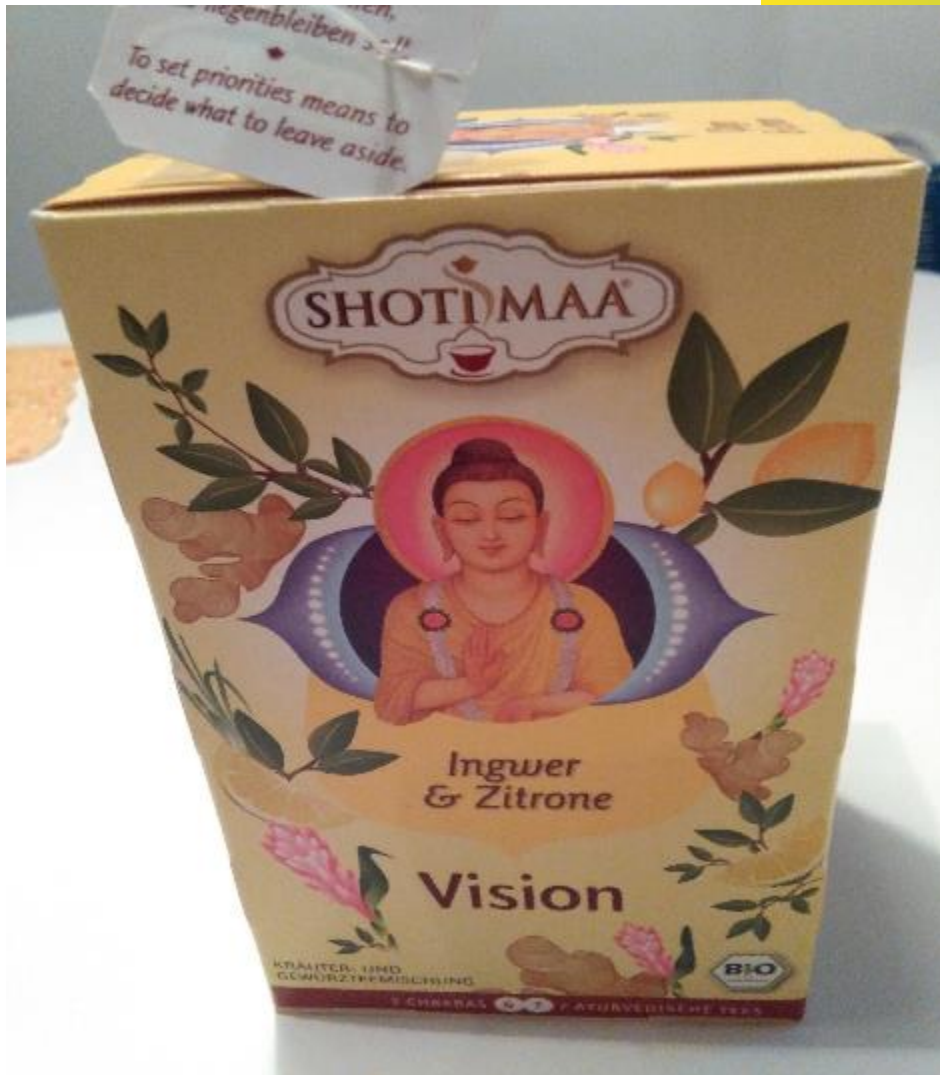
PRIORITY SETTING IN HEALTH INFORMATION

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To set priorities means to decide what to leave aside



- Important barriers to priority setting
 - advisory panel lacking health economic knowledge and/or allocation experience
 - lack of trust between stakeholders
 - unbalanced representation of expertise and stakeholders
 - conflicts of interest
 - politics preventing (program) process evaluation
 - discontinuity of personnel
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Maybe wanted, but generally this is bad practice priority setting
